**Disappointingly we never had a September/October sailfish bite. Things were certainly looking good in May but the bait buggered off for winter.**

The blues on the shelf have been a bit of a donut saver the past few seasons in Sep/Oct/Nov but this year they were very hit and miss for us. Two in a day the best in local waters that I know of. Fraser once again went off for blue marlin but that pool of fish disappeared very quickly. Last season they were like clock work, hanging out off Sandy Cape for a few weeks, then the Noosa Canyons, then the Dog Leg, then the Gold Coast, then Coffs Harbour and so on as they moved south in the EAC. This year they were at Fraser one week then nothing and no bite anywhere. I have seen random captures on Facebook anywhere from Sydney and Port Macquarie etc north but no numbers. Hasn't really been a big bite off the Gold Coast either. They had a few little bites, but nothing consistent. Once again, more consistent than us unfortunately. Anyway for the trailerboat guys, keep your ears peeled and it is only a 2hr tow down there and the grounds are way closer than us if they get a blue bite and we don't.

Most of the action off Breaksea Spit was blues once again. Little blacks in the Bay was a bit of a non-event. 2 for a weekend was the best I heard about on the inside and lots of zeros. No big numbers on the outside but a few. Boats have been seeing them straight lining from the bar to the heavy tackle grounds and I believe they turned up on the last day of the tournament up there or for the boats working the 13mile bar and north. There was also a good crop of mixed pelagics up there in the 13 mile area and these fish are yet to be carried here in the EAC.

From now on we can expect things to get better and better. Two boats saw two each over two days to win and place in the Mooloolaba Billfish Bash tournament in late November. A few line class yellowfin were also weighed in. No crop of mahi mahi yet either. Most of the fish were seen east of the Banks but on charter I have noticed bait showing up on the normal 8-10-12 mile grounds daily and it is only a matter of time if good purple water pushes in there that fish will be caught in close. There have been marlin caught in the Trench/Hutchies/Flinders area and the spotty mackerel are already as far south as Yamba in NSW. The odd Spanish mackerel is out the front but I would prefer to see the water looking a lot more purple. Pre Christmas, the Trench can be a good spot to look as well if they get some bait. Sometimes the bait this time of year is frogmouth pilchards and white bait. It shows up on your sounder but you can't jig it but that doesn't worry the predators. They are still there eating it or the bonito and stuff eating the froggies.

Well done to recent tournament winners and boats that have travelled away flying the SCGFC flag. Also well done to our captains, deckies and hosties that have just finished the Cairns marlin season. "Kekoa" and Captain Luke Fallon and Kelly Fallon featured in reports along with Josh Allwood and Christie Turner on "Iona II" and Tim Bidey on the "Release" keeping the proud tradition of good Cairns deckies going from guys and gals who learnt their craft from the SCGFC breeding ground.

I saw on my Facebook that Heath Irvine's "Kamikaze" may have gone back to back in the best dressed boat at the Cairns Lady's Ribbons Tournament yet again. Quite possibly some fishing prizes too. Well done Heath and Heather.

Well done to Tony Kemp and crew on winning our Spring Shootout on his magnificent 45' Bertram "Take Time". Certainly pays to get the first blue of a tournament, beating "Keneka" for a confirmed tagging time by 2min and walking away with most of the spoils. I believe the no frills Saturday/Sunday concept is going to be the way the Classic Tournament will be conducted this February too. Considering the change of date, the adverse weather forecast and everything being hastily arranged we pulled off a great event.

SCGFC anglers Dan Barker and Channon Arbutnot did well to come 1st and 2nd at the Hervey Bay Tournament in mid November fishing on "Pole Dancer" against 40 other boat. They pulled off a 100% catch rate with five blue marlin on 37kg fishing with hooks in lures and switched stripe marlin on 15kg to blitz the rest of the field. Not red hot fishing like it was the weeks prior.

A win by Brent Higgins' "Sicario" at the MGFC Billfish Bash Tournament has set the club up well in the Albert and Pauline SEQ Trophy through placings and participation. "Chaos" tagged a couple of black marlin as well and was ahead on time but unfortunately had an unfinancial angler aboard who caught a fish.

Best get your memberships paid everyone as soon as we tick over a new financial year to ensure you get all the member benefits like Reel Talk, access to the members only Facebook Page, the end of year presentation dinner, the Christmas break-up party and so on rather than leaving it to the last minute before fishing on a competitive club boat or doing a tournament or whatever. No doubt most people would have heard about the 1,430 pound black marlin caught off Lady Musgrave Island and weighed at Hervey Bay by the Gold Coast towered Viking game boat "Too Easy II". Rob Crane the owner/angler is a privateer not in the club scene and it would have been a massive travesty if that fish would have exceeded the

45 year old record and it amounted to nought as he was outside of the game fish club system. Another reason to pay up in July every year.

On that large marlin, lots of interesting stories to come out of it. Terry Parker our founding life member was aboard the boat that trip. Terry is an ex Cairns marlin boat skipper. Russell Gage the skipper of "Too Easy II" was a Cairns marlin deckie on a boat called "Broadbill", a lovely big Pleysier back in the day, owned by Johno Johnson, one of the leading lights of the Australian gamefish scene. Johno hit 100 years old the other week and actually would have passed away whilst the crew was fighting this fish on one of Johno's lures Gagey had from the "Broadbill" days. How amazing is that. He must have been looking down on the boys from on high for it all to go to plan. As Peter Pakula said at our recent club night, Johno never gave out stuff from off the boat and for Gagey to have been given that lure by him was saying something itself. A ripe female like that in the Capricorn/Bunker group with attendant male marlin swimming with here pretty much confirms that area as another spawning ground for black marlin like the reef between Townsville and PNG. Dr Julian Pepperall speaking at our recent club night said it may have been around 20 years old but ageing will be difficult on it as even at that size, the ear bones would have only been 2mm across and the early growth rings indecipherable. Add the 1,430 to a 1,050 Tim Richardson from Tradition caught the season prior, some weighed 900s and tales from other very experience people, the Capricorn/Bunker Group to Breaksea Spit area is an exciting place to be fishing in November/December every year. It will be good to see "Kekoa" join "Mistress" in fishing the area full time from now on and seeing what they find and how they go.

# SPRING SHOOTOUT



After a false start on the original dates due to terrible weather and iffy weather forecast for the first weekend of November, the changed dates, it was decided to scale down the 2018 Sunshine Coast Gamefishing Club Spring Shootout with major sponsor Ben Campbell Building Group into revised format one day event with half the entry fee (juniors could still enter free but had to be nominated), fixed Calcutta prices and the presentation straight after fishing on the Saturday night. This proved to be a great concept all things considered with the Sunday ending up with a strong wind warning issued by the Bureau of Meteorology. 10 boats from 3 clubs comprising 34 senior anglers and 5 juniors headed out to sea on the Saturday into a light NW wind which turned into a solid NEer around lunch time.

Catching the first fish of a tournament goes a long way to setting you up a lot of the time and so it proved this time for Tony Kempe and the crew of Take Time, his 45' Bertram. Angler Scott Heaney's blue marlin was tagged at 9:43am on the Saturday, 2minutes before Darryl Lund's on Keneka. In total there were 16 strikes recorded by the fleet, 11 hookups and 5 tags comprising 3 blue marlin and one striped marlin and a non qualifying mahi mahi tagged by a junior angler.



# CHARTER REPORT

Well we never had a September/October sailfish bite. Things were certainly looking good bait wise at the 18mile through May but it moved on in June.

I found winter an ok snapper season. I still think it was easier back in my Stabicraft days. I now have 11 years of full time experience finding them and that last two years I have been looking for very subtle stuff on my sounder, gravel with 1-2m lifts and little wire weed patches etc. It is then hard to know if it was a good season or I was lucky finding them in a few spots. I have put more GPS marks in my plotter the last two years than the preceding 5 I reckon as I am looking at the less obvious stuff. Early on all of my big fish came from in close, including the first 98cm one we caught at Caloundra 12mile and a 93cm from Caloundra 8mile. In the end I ended up with a 98, 91, 88 & 87cm from the Double Island Point country but didn't pull many trophies off the Hards like the season before. Lots of 70s and 80s came from Caloundra but mid 70s was pulling me up everywhere else. I found myself fishing back on the high country of the western Hards mostly this year with only a couple of good hits on the Mud country. The season prior I was getting good numbers and all my trophies off the Mud. Come late October my snapper disappeared so I started with summer reef fishing mode on top of the Banks for hussar and parrot. Whilst on holidays my Facebook lit up with snapper everywhere the weekend of the Hervey Bay Tournament so they must have had one final bite before summer.

I'm still in limbo at the moment waiting for the pelagics to turn up. Through October there was the odd big wahoo getting about. I couldn't find them. At the time of writing spotty mackerel are already at Yamba and reports from Noosa, Coolum and Moreton Bay. Also early season Spanish mackerel from the Gneerings and Sunshine Reef. I can't find them with just a few rat kings off the Gneerings and football yellowfin at the Banks. The weather has also been shocking so not getting out much.

# HERVEY BAY GAME FISHING COMP 2018

WITH CHANNON ARBUTHNOT

After a very successful 2017/18 season I was fortunate enough to take out Champion Angler for our club I was also awarded Champion Angler Rally Day's which is sponsored by Club Marine. The prize of this this category is \$750 to go towards fishing tournament of your choice, so with a little bit of planning I asked Dave McMaster if we could take Pole Dancer and fish the Harvey Bay GFC tournament with another rally day weekend winner Daniel Barker. Dan and I drove up to the marina on the Thursday where we met Dave on Pole Dancer, after the tournament briefing we chugged out to our anchorage under the Lighthouse at the tip of Fraser Island...



## DAY 1

Next morning saw us chugging out to the Northern Fraser shelf area east of the 13 mile cutting. Start fishing was called and before too long that been a lot of fish scene to the south. As we sat there listening to hook ups after being called in we started to think we made the wrong decision coming north. Then we got the ball rolling with a quick blue to myself and we were on the board. An hour or so goes by and we find ourselves backing down on another nice blue we get that one tagged after a short fight and we are 2 from 2 and it was clear we were in the right spot. A few hours passed with not a lot of action when out of the depths came another blue smashing the long corner hooking up and after an hour and 20 we had our third tag for the day and a solid lead over the fleet. Cease fishing was called so we started chugging back to the mothership to get our tag cards in and our gear all checked.

## DAY 2

We headed back north and as we arrive there we notice the ocean is alive and there are birds everywhere and we all have a good feeling about the day ahead.

Start fishing was called and the lines were deployed we had a few other competing boats follow us and it wasn't just us in our new found honey hole. But that didn't seem to worry us as not long into the morning we had a Striped Marlin come in and try to eat the long corner 3 times before we decided to switch him to a live bait. The switch went like clock work and we hooked up to the stripe on 15kg was a nice 100-120 kg fish after an hour long battle we got the tag in, we couldn't put a foot wrong going 4 from 4 so far for the weekend. This was when the team started to get a little whiff of a proper lead over the rest of the fleet with 3 blues on 37kg and a stripe on 15kg making us 2 fish in front. After a few hours we had attracted a fair fleet of boats trolling around and around us and the fishing was rather slow on day 2, we had a little yellow fin which we tagged as a field goal but other than that there was no action on the radio. With boats everywhere the mighty Pole Dancer raises another blue out of the middle of everyone and this one was tagged quick and it put us 3 fish in the lead. After this fish we all decide it's time to leave our now busy honey hole and track south. After a couple of hours we get down east of the 4 mile when another nice blue piles on the long

corner only to miss the hooks twice but then he comes in hot with a full head shoulders then tail out of the water bite he hooks up and then comes the blistering run. The tag goes in and we start the celebrations yahooping on the back deck. With 6 heavy tackle fish we are out in front with a convincing lead. Cease fishing was called so we ran in to try for a billfish grand slam after getting a stripe and a blue we needed to catch the easy one but it didn't happen unfortunately. After handing the tag cards in and having our tackle measure done we rafted up with Special K and Mistress for bit of a chat and a few beverages, it was a good night.

## DAY 3

The next morning we woke to a bit of a southerly wind blowing the decision was made to go light tackle but we couldn't raise a fish to save ourselves. Until the last 5 minutes before cease fishing where we had a little black come in and eat the teaser, he was switched over to a swim gar. But the hooks missed there place and the fish swam free. This was the end of our flawless hookup - tag ratio but it didn't matter we had won the tournament with 5 blues on 37kg a striped marlin on 15 kg and a yellowfin.






